

Where to get Diabetes Supplies- Lower Hume

People who are diagnosed with diabetes are able to register with the [National Diabetes Services Scheme \(NDSS\)](#). The NDSS is run through Diabetes Australia and registering allows people with diabetes to purchase equipment at a subsidised rate.

Registration forms need to be signed by either your GP or Credentialed Diabetes Educator.

Lancets (needles) for your finger pricking device:

The most convenient place to purchase these is from your local pharmacy (see above) without a script. It is a good idea to take your finger pricking device to the store to ensure you get the correct lancets.

Please note: *The lancets are not subsidised through the NDSS system.*

Insulin needles:

Insulin needles are subsidized by the NDSS however you need to have a new NDSS form completed when you go onto needing insulin. These registration forms need to be signed by either your GP or Credentialed Diabetes Educator.

Completed forms can be taken to your local pharmacy and the needles will be supplied or by calling Diabetes Australia 1300 136 588.
